

## Marling Diamond: TRIPS AND EXPEDITIONS

One of Marling Sixth Form's key trips is to the United Nations in New York City, where our students act as ambassadors for a UN member state. Alternatively, you may decide that you wish to spend a month working in a remote location, perhaps building a new school, or you'd like to travel to Geneva to see how medicine, physics and humanities work together in the wider world. There is also an extensive range of subject-specific trips, whether you choose to travel to Munich with the chemistry department, analyse contemporary sources in Palestine with the history department or research conditions just seconds after the Big Bang at CERN with the physics department. All these opportunities are available to Marling Sixth Formers and form an important part of our extra and super-curricular offer.

## **Borneo Expedition 2022**

As a grand finale to their time in sixth form, students have the opportunity to take part in an expedition to Borneo in the summer of 2022. The month-long expedition provides a unique opportunity to explore a new culture, experience a different way of life and make a real contribution to community development and environmental conservation initiatives. Students will work directly with local communities, whether helping to dig foundations for a classroom, collecting rubbish to be recycled, or planting trees.











## Global Action - Geneva

On this trip students visit and work with a huge range of international agencies including the United Nations, the Office of UN Commissioner for Human Rights, the World Trade Organisation and the World Health Organisation. It is an ideal trip for students of geography, politics, economics, philosophy & ethics, sociology and those interested in medicine, and is recommended for anyone interested in learning about how international agencies are working to create a better world. All students that go are also eligible for the widely-recognised ASDAN Universities Award.



## Change the World!

Travel to The Big Apple, debate at the UN, sit in the very seats of world leaders and take the role of a real ambassador to debate, form alliances and get your motions passed. The three-day conference is the culmination of a week-long trip in which students learn about the history of the UN, the island of Manhattan and of course some of those rather well known icons such as the Statue of Liberty, the Brooklyn Bridge, Empire State Building, Central Park and perhaps there'll be a moment or two for retail therapy!
