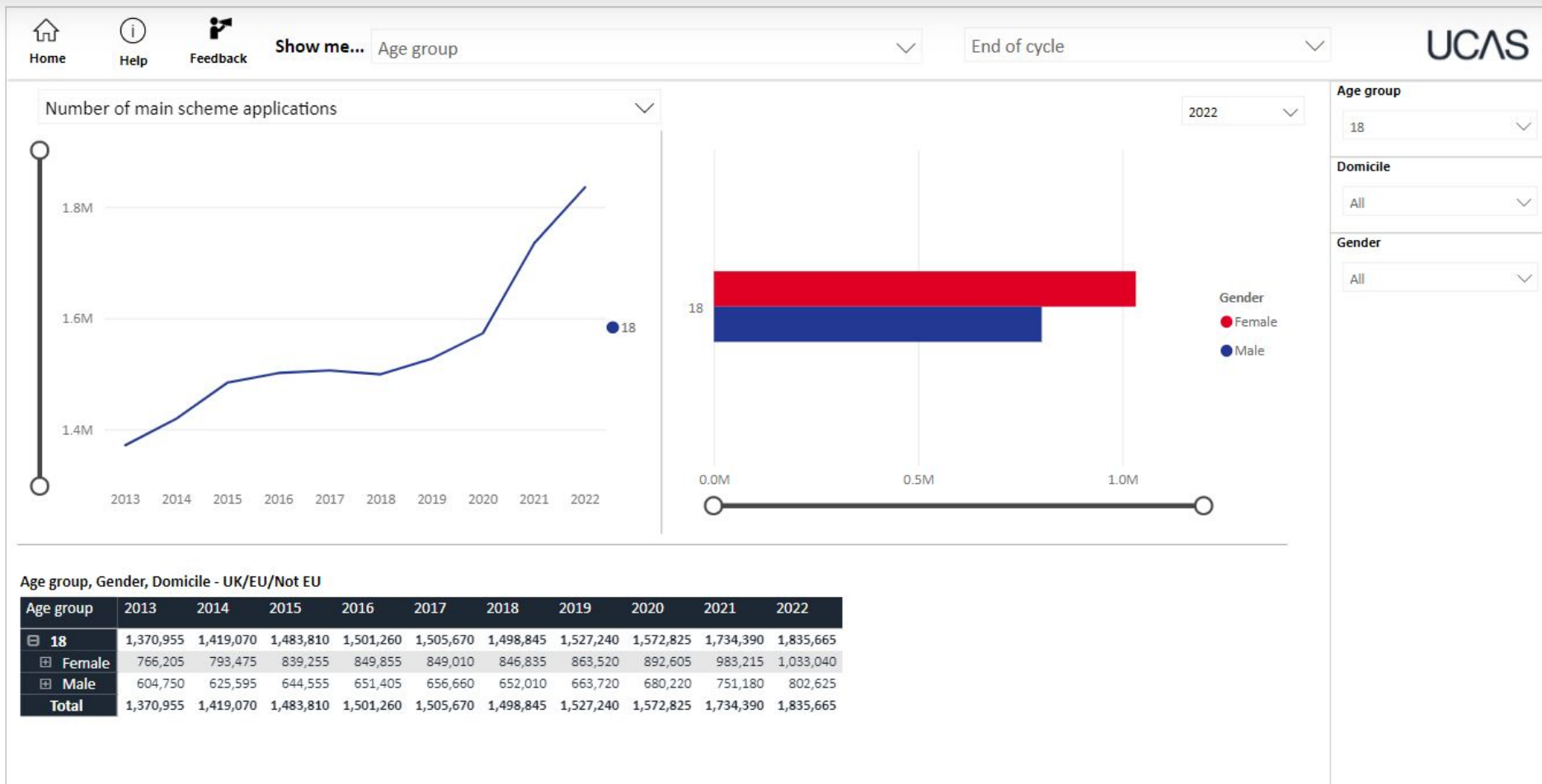

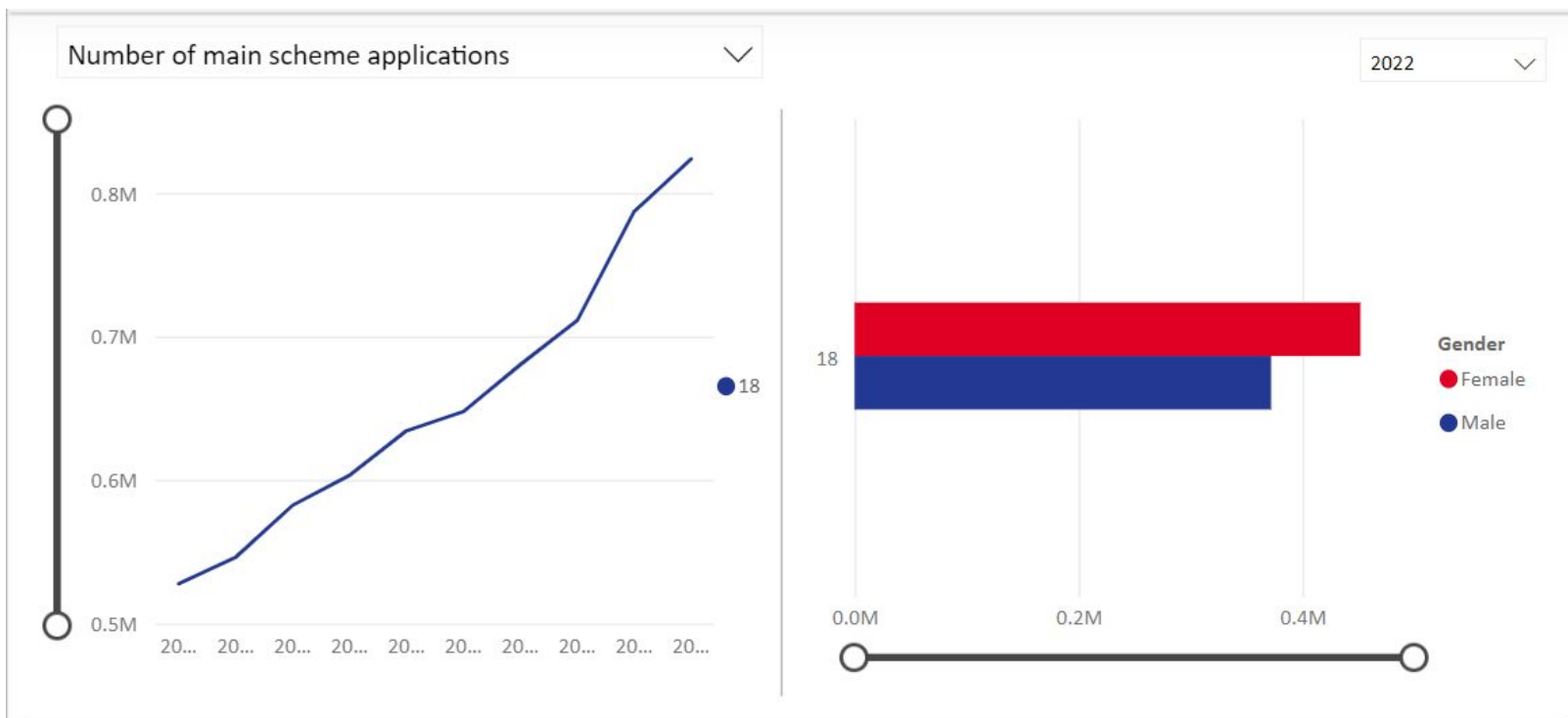
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Applications from 18yos to all unis last year





Applications from 18yo's to high tariff unis last year



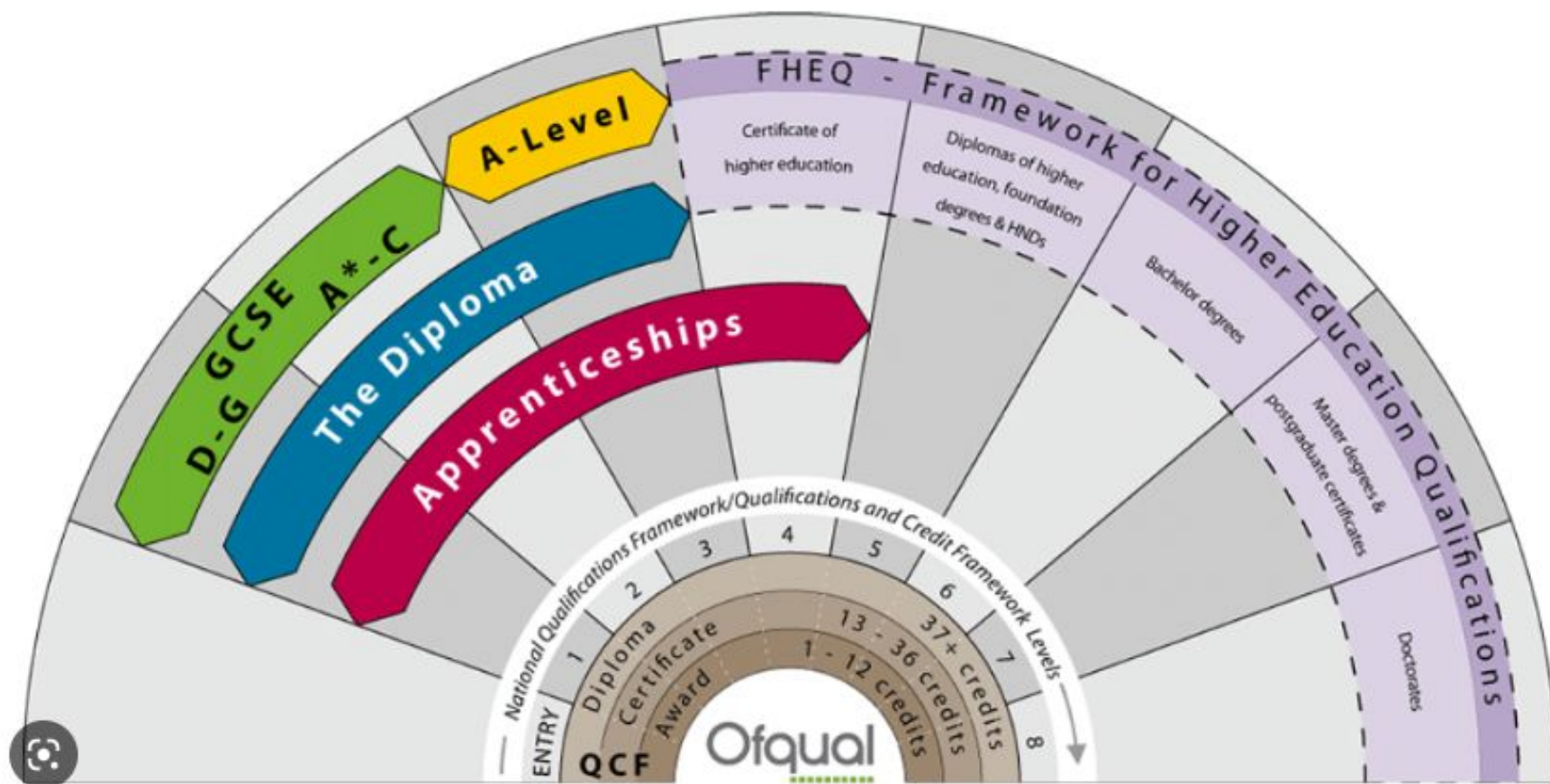

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Apprenticeship levels range from level 2 (intermediate) through to level 7 (master's level) in more than 1,500 different job roles.

There are four types of apprenticeship

- Intermediate (level 2)
- Advanced (level 3)
- Higher (levels 4 and above)
- Degree (levels 6 - 7)



Intermediate apprenticeships

Intermediate apprenticeships are typically considered to be the same level as five GCSE passes.

Intermediate apprenticeships are a fantastic way to get started with your career in an entry level role within an organisation.

Advanced apprenticeships

Advanced apprenticeships are considered to be the same level as two or three A level passes. Many individuals who have completed their A levels or other level 3 qualifications will undertake an advanced apprenticeship as it will enable them to gain experience in the workplace and undertake a variety of different tasks.

Higher apprenticeships

Higher apprenticeships include qualifications at levels 4 and above. They can be suitable for those looking to progress from level 3 qualifications, including advanced apprenticeships.

Degree apprenticeships

Degree apprenticeships are offered by universities and other higher education providers. They contain either a full degree or degree-level qualification and go up to master's level (which is post-graduate).

Which level is right for you?

The type of apprenticeship undertaken will depend on both the needs of the employer and the job role as well as the apprentice, their previous experience and qualifications held.

Your training provider will also be able to guide you as to the most appropriate level for you.

Apprenticeships and how to prepare

- Ensure that students understand that apprenticeship application processes will often vary between different employers. Some will ask for a CV and covering letter, others will use the government's Find an Apprenticeship system whilst others will have their own in-house processes.
- Help students to be ready for the apprenticeship application process by having some pre-prepared text and responses that they can tweak and adapt. If your students have also been working on their personal statement, this can often be used as a starting point.
- Encourage students to submit their applications as soon as they are ready and not to wait for the deadline. If an employer is overwhelmed with applications, they may decide to close their recruitment window early, meaning that students could miss out.
- Encourage students to make multiple apprenticeship applications simultaneously. Although this may feel difficult for them to be juggling different applications and recruitment processes (especially deadlines for responses), it is a really useful strategy in helping them to keep their options open and to remain optimistic about the recruitment process.

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Apprenticeships

Competition Some apprenticeship vacancies are very competitive. For example National Grid received 16,500 applications for just 150 places on its School Leaver Programme – equivalent to 110 people for each place.

Prestige In recent years stricter rules have been put in place regarding what an apprenticeship can consist of. In addition new apprenticeships have been created for previously graduate-only professions, like becoming a solicitor. These changes have helped to increase the prestige of apprenticeships.

Earn while you learn Unlike going to university where students normally accrue debt, apprentices are paid from their first day of training. If you do a degree apprenticeship, you will even have your degree paid for while you earn a salary - that's double savings!

Practice and theory Apprenticeships typically consist of 80% on-the-job training, and 20% studying. For some opportunities this means 4 days per week at the workplace and 1 day at a college, and for others this means you will work for about 10 months a year, then you'll spend 2 months just studying.

Types There are several types of apprenticeship. At any time there tends to be more vacancies at the lower levels of qualification.

Traineeship: Level 1 or Level 2 (equivalent to GCSEs or below). Lasting a maximum of 6 months, they are unpaid but you gain skills and qualifications.

Intermediate: Level 2 (equivalent to 5 GCSEs).

Advanced: Level 3 (equivalent to 2 A-levels).

Higher: Level 4 and above (equivalent to Foundation degree and higher).

Degree apprenticeship: Level 6 or Level 7 (equivalent to Bachelor's or master's degree). As well as working on the job you study for a degree. You earn from day one and your tuition fees are paid by the employer

School Leaver Programme: Some employers run their own bespoke training programmes which give A-level students the chance to gain a university degree and/or professional qualification (depending on the programme), while working for the company and earning a wage. Employers include KPMG and PwC.

Standards Apprenticeships are split into different Standards which define the skills, knowledge and behaviours required in a particular role. These Standards have been developed by expert employer groups known as 'trailblazers'.

There are lots of Standards to choose from - from Beauty Therapy to Recruitment to Chartered Management.

Jobs Apprenticeships are jobs like any other type of job - so to secure one you need to impress the employer enough to want to recruit you. Also important to bear in mind is that often apprenticeship vacancies are only advertised for as long as the available spots take to be filled, so

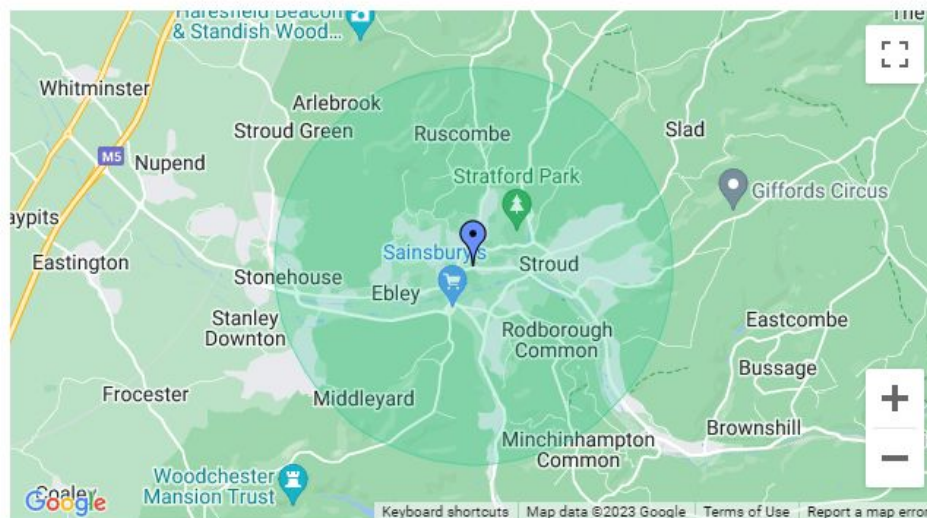

- **16 October 2023 for 2024 entry at 18:00 (UK time)** – deadline for any course at the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, or for most courses in medicine, veterinary medicine/science, and dentistry. You can add choices with a different deadline later, but don't forget you can only have five choices in total.
- **31 January 2024 for 2024 entry at 18:00 (UK time)** – deadline for the majority of courses.

General Guidance

Your personal statement is your opportunity to convince the university that you are right for their course.

- Maximum of 47 lines and 4,000 characters (about one typed page). Aim to use up the majority of the character allowance.
 - Only **one** statement for **all** your course choices. Admissions tutors for all your courses will see the same Personal Statement so choose similar courses
 - If you don't know where to start, begin by making some bullet points of anything that may be relevant. Then add some detail to those points.
 - **Draft**, show someone, **re-write**; **draft**, show someone, **re-write**... (repeat)

- ❖ **Tell the truth**: if you are asked for an interview you will be questioned about the contents of your personal statement. Don't exaggerate.
 - ❖ **Don't use humour**, it rarely works.
 - ❖ **Your own work**: Personal statements are checked by UCAS for plagiarism using sophisticated software.

UCAS and Unifrog have advice on writing your personal statement.

Upload your personal statement onto Unifrog so that your subject reference writers can refer to it.

Super curricular & academic

"Think **super-curricular** NOT extra-curricular"

Super-curricular is all the things you have done (beyond A Level work) which relate to the course.

What have you done/read/seen/written/attended to help you succeed and know that this subject/course is right for you?

DON'T: narrate the content of your A Levels

DO: specify a particular element of your A Levels that is of interest

Extra-curricular

You as a person - personal skills/interests/activities, relate to the course where possible

CONCLUSION

Why should the university offer you a place?

What career aspirations do you have?

Mention your gap year if applicable



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Personal Statement: Structure Overview

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- **Introduction:** If you are stuck, write the **opening statement** last
- **Main body of statement:** Supercurricular and academic

Demonstrate your personal interest and insight into the course and tailor this closely to the course descriptions of **all** the courses to which you are applying.

Apply the **ABC** rule wherever possible:

- Outline the **Activity** – what you did
- Describe the **Benefit** – what you learnt and how you grew
- Relate to the **Course**

Don't **tell** the admissions tutor what you have done, **show** them specific details which add depth:

	Use the ABC rule to expand
What are you enjoying about your A Level study (specific topics)?	
Which specific modules of the degree do you look forward to studying in greater depth?	
What academically related activities have you taken part in beyond the classroom?	
What did you learn from related activities such as reading; work shadowing; taster days?	
If your degree is not related to your A Level study, what related knowledge and experience do you have?	
What career aspirations do you have; what insight do you have into where a degree will lead you?

So how do you increase the chances of success? Demonstrate "Academic

Universities want to know that you're passionate and interested in the subject. Whether it's books, documentaries, websites, or scientific journals, you should aim to read and study around the subject as much as possible. This will help you to reinforce your interest in (eg: veterinary medicine) and keep you up to date with the latest developments and advances in the field.

Join clubs that support your interest in the subject. If they don't exist in the school - start one up! That also shows initiative and drive, and other supporting skills.

Stand out from the crowd - what can you demonstrate that others can't?
