- Breadth option and Marling Diamond Super/Extra curricular activities






Examination results 2018-2020

We can make a difference to your A Level results

Marling Sixth Form is in the top 15% of all A Level Providers nationally for Value Added based on data from 2018-2020.

Value Added measures the difference we make.

It means that whether you join us with 80 points or 38 points at GCSE, you stand a better chance of exceeding your predicted A Level grades than if you study at most other places.

Marling students go on to study at universities across the country, to join apprenticeships, to music and drama college, into employment or onto gap years...





















University Destinations & Courses Marling Sixth Form Leavers 2022




