Biologists Bring Home the Awards

We had 29 A Level biologists take part in the British Biology Olympiad (20 Year 12 students and 9 Year 13s). The British Biology Olympiad is designed for year 13s and is a competition run in conjunction with the Royal Society of Biology. It aims to stimulate students with an interest in biology to expand and extend their talent, and to be suitably rewarded with publicly recognised certificates. In total over 10,000 students from more than 700 schools worldwide took part in this year's competition with our students receiving these awards: I Gold, 10 Silvers, 7 Bronzes, 4 Highly Commended, 5 Commended and 2 for Participation. Congratulations to Josh (Year 12) for achieving a Gold award, and to all of the year 12s who did particularly well! We are very proud of all those that took part.






Chemists Take Wins in Olympiad

24 year 12s took part in the Intermediate Biology Olympiad.

The competition is open to students in the first year of post-16 education anywhere in the world and is run in conjunction with the Royal Society of Biology and Warwick university.

Our students did extremely well! We received 3 Gold, 3 Silver, 6 Bronze, 5 Highly Commended and 2 Commended.

I am excited to report the recent visit by Elena Jones, a Cardiff University Graduate, to our 6th form Geology students.


Year 12 AS Level Geology students had the privilege of welcoming Elena Jones, a distinguished Cardiff University Graduate, who gave an enlightening talk about Earth Science degree routes, the experience of Earth Science based degrees, and sustainability in Geoscience.

Elena began her talk by emphasising the accessibility of Earth Science degrees to students with diverse qualifications. She reassured our students that a passion for Earth science and a curiosity about the world around us are the key ingredients for success in this field. Regardless of their previous qualifications or academic backgrounds. Earth science

degrees welcome students from various educational pathways, offering them the opportunity to explore

and excel in this fascinating subject.

To make the learning experience more immersive, Elena brought along a collection of rock, fossil, and mineral specimens for the students to view up close. Students had the opportunity to examine the intricate details of fossils and marvel at specimens of garnets from southern Spain. Furthermore, Elena highlighted the importance of fieldwork and practical experience in Earth Science based degrees. She shared anecdotes from her own experiences, emphasising how field trips and hands-on research projects played a vital role in deepening her understanding of the subject matter. Her stories ignited a sense of adventure among our students, inspiring them to look forward to future opportunities for fieldwork and practical application.



The final part of the talk focussed on sustainability in Earth science. This field encompasses a wide range of considerations, including the energy industry, geothermal resources, and deep-sea mining of minerals. Within the energy sector, Earth scientists play a vital role in promoting sustainable practices and reducing reliance on fossil fuels.

I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to Elena for her visit and for bringing the captivating world of Earth science to life for our students








An A Level art exhibition evening was held for students, parents and staff to showcase the amazing work from our Year 13 students.








FOREIGN LANGUAGES

Students enjoyed dissecting rats in the dissection club (these were purchased from a biological supplier).





Did you know almost 60 different languages are spoken by Marling students?




Day 4: A giant water slide, table tennis, badminton and rounders were just a few of the activities enjoyed by students at the House Celebrations!



Moving up the Ranks

After attending the Southern Region qualifiers for the British Championships, I ended up qualifying in all three disciplines/weapons, which are Foil, Épée and Sabre. Each discipline uses a different sword, has a different target area, as well as different rules. At the time I didn't know, but later on found out that I was the only person to qualify for all three weapons in the U18 Men's in the whole of Britain! A few months later I travelled to the English Institute of Sport in Sheffield for 4 days, during which time I competed in the British Championships U18 Men's Foil, Épée and Sabre competitions. I ended up placing 37th in the Foil, 18th in the Sabre and 31st in the Épée. The most exciting event was probably the Épée, which is my main weapon. After a terrible pool round, I clawed it back in Direct Elimination, coming up against someone seeded more than 20 places higher than me in the Round of 64, however won 15-9, securing my place in the Round of 32. This time, once again, I was placed against someone seeded much higher than me, and unfortunately after a long bout lost 15-11.1 was disappointed as I made quite a few mistakes during this bout, but ended up with a decent result nonetheless.


Year 13 Alton Towers Trip
